Dear Parishioners:

Public Masses to resume May 30th as you no doubt know from Jennifer's weekly update emails, from the *East Tennessee Catholic*, or from other media. *Deo gratis!* They will resume, albeit, with some very specific restrictions as contained in the bishop's decree. You might not agree with all of them; I might not. It doesn't matter: Bishop Stika is the pastor of the diocese and it is his decision. It is not imprudent. What is important is that we will have public Masses again!

As you can see from the decree and explanatory drawings and statements, we cannot accommodate all our parishioners at only three Masses with the spacing requirements. I have therefore decided that I will add another Mass so that we will have the two Masses on Saturday evening and two Masses on Sunday. I also have my Mass at Cor Jesu Monastery. In order to balance all these the first Mass on Sunday will be at 10:00am followed by a Mass at 11:30. These times will, I believe, disrupt people's schedules and habits the least compared to any other arrangement. We will also put chairs in the narthex to allow some additional seating consistent with the spacing. Please note that this means some who usually go to the 5pm will have to come to a Sunday Mass and the same for those who usually come to the 10:30am. Focus on what is important: you can again be fed by the Holy Eucharist!

PRO-LIFE NEWS AND NOTES:



I wanted to share an uplifting article I read in a recent **40 Days for Life** publication. Paula is a young woman who experienced tragic events in her life beginning at 16 when she joined a community youth group, not realizing that the adult mentors were Planned Parenthood employees. Slowly she was influenced to volunteer for Planned Parenthood after hearing remarks such as, "You care about women, right?" Paula began helping to organize Planned Parenthood booths at events and within 2 years she was counseling clients and lobbying public officials. At the University of Memphis, she headed up a pro-abortion student group, which brought her into dialogue with the pro-life student group, which planted seeds for her pro-life conversion. However, because her heart had become hardened after hearing for so long that pro-life people lie, her conversion took some time to manifest. In 2016, Paula became pregnant but miscarried; she was saddened, had a funeral for her baby, and grieved for months. Her heart began to change after this, and she grew closer to the Lord. After beginning to feel better, she decided to date again, but her first encounter with a young man led to a terrifying rape at gunpoint. She became pregnant after the rape but welcomed the pregnancy—she now had a purpose in life. When her church members learned she was expecting they began pressuring her to abort the baby, even late into her pregnancy, offering to pay the \$10,000 cost to fly across country and undergo an expensive third trimester abortion. Church members called Paula's child the "spawn of Satan" and accused her of "tainting the gene pool". Even after the birth of her son, Caleb, the church community complained that the baby was a "bad influence" on the other children. After the church made a large Mother's Day donation to the abortion industry, Paula and Caleb left the church and found a new faith community. Today, Paula is happy to speak all over the country, empowering expectant mothers in crisis to choose life. She is the community outreach director for the Memphis Coalition for Life and has saved many babies as a sidewalk counselor outside of Planned Parenthood. Paula states, "Without my faith, I'm not sure I would be alive. God's plan was bigger than any plan I could ever have for myself. Caleb was the best change of plans ever." Pray for Paula and all sidewalk counselors and for an end to the scourge of abortion.
